OVERVIEW

The Ramona Tree Trust has secured the support locally of the Ramona Design Review Board, the Ramona Village Design Board, the Ramona Community Planning Group and the Ramona Chamber of Commerce for the nomination of the Ramona Main Street Colonnade to the National Register of Historic Places. Obtaining recognition would vitally protect the historical Colonnade that consists of trees that were planted by the pioneers in the early 20th century.

BACKGROUND


The Ramona Tree Trust has secured the support locally of the Ramona Design Review Board, the Ramona Village Design Board, the Ramona Community Planning Group and the Ramona Chamber of Commerce for the nomination of the Ramona Main Street Colonnade to the National Register of Historic Places. Obtaining recognition would vitally protect the historical Colonnade that consists of trees that were planted by the pioneers in the early 20th century.

The Ramona Colonnade is a central feature of the rural town, forming the gateway for both residents and visitors alike. The majority of the trees planted in the Colonnade are 100 years old and are a recognizable and historic symbol of Ramona, playing an integral role in the community's character.

The National Register of Historical Places serves to protect identified historical zones such as Ramona's Colonnade which is a real treasure to the community. Listing in the National Register assures review of federal projects that might adversely affect the character of the historic landscape, and also allows for an automatic listing in the California Register of Historical Resources which affords consideration during the State (CEQA) environmental review process. The listing of this community asset to the National Register of Historic Places would recognize the value of this historic and unique area.
